**CAMDEN, NJ – Symphony in C under the leadership of Music Director Rossen Milanov is pleased to announce a new Chamber Music Series to be held at the Markeim Arts Center in Haddonfield.**

**The season opens on Saturday, October 6, 2012 at 8:00 p.m. when Symphony in C's musicians will present *Prokofiev's Flute Sonata*. The program begins with César Cui's Petites Duos (5) for flute, violin and piano, Op. 56. Next on the program, **Haddonfield's favorite flutist Megan Emigh** performs **Sergei Prokofiev's** passionate *Flute Sonata in D, Op. 94*. The program concludes with **Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov's** romantic *Piano Trio in C minor*.**

**On Saturday, February 9, 2013 at 8:00 p.m.** Symphony in C's musicians will present ***Mendelssohn's Piano Trio***. The program features Symphony in C's concertmaster Stefani Collins and Principal cellist Bronwyn Banerdt. The concert begins with **Felix Mendelssohn's Piano Trio, No 1 in D minor, Op. 49**. The concert concludes with **Robert Schumann's Piano Trio, No. 2 in F major, Op. 80**.

**On Saturday, April 13, 2013 at 8:00 p.m.** Symphony in C will present **Haydn's String Quartet**. The program begins with **Giuseppe Tartini's Trumpet Concerto in D major, D53**, featuring **Caleb Hudson** on trumpet. **Joseph Haydn's The Seven Last Words of Christ** will conclude the program.
